## Proposed Initiatives to ICAO - 2020

- 1) Update the ICAO Birdstrike Information System (IBIS) Manual Doc 9332 (3rd edition published 1989) Q4 2023
- 2) Permit International Data Access and Data Sharing Q4 2024

## ADOP.015.03 Job Card formalized 2 February 2021

"Enhance global aviation safety by improving international reporting of wildlife/aircraft strike incidents as well as international data access and data sharing."

# Update the IBIS Manual – Why?

- ✓ ALL existing sections of Manual require updating; new sections needed
- ✓ ECCAIRS aka: the <u>European Coordination Centre</u> for Accident and Incident Reporting System has recently been updated
- ✓ New software systems (e.g., Microsoft Excel) routinely used for recording / submitting strike data
- ✓ Doc 9137 (2020) defined wildlife / aircraft strike but there is no standardized definition of WHAT should be reported as a strike
- No universal minimum standards for strike report forms

## Update the IBIS Manual – Why?

- ✓ No guidance re: strike data collection or documentation procedures for member States (who, what, when, where, why, how)
- ✓ No guidance on strike data validation (QC/QA)
- ✓ No guidance on basic data analyses (why? how? Metrics, KPI's)
- ✓ No guidance standardizing key word usage (e.g., strike=bird strike=birdstrike=wildlife strike?, report vs document, snarge vs remains, etc.)

## International Data Access / Sharing

CHALLENGES: Re: Strike Data From ICAO Member States

- ✓ IBIS DATA UNAVAILABLE / INACCESSIBLE
- ✓ STRIKE DATA INCOMPLETE / INACCURATE FOR MOST STATES
- ✓ MUST USE ECCAIR SYSTEM TO ACCESS INDIVIDUAL NATION'S DATA IF THEY USED ECCAIRS


## CONSEQUENCES: Of Incomplete Data Within Member States

- ✓ RISK MANAGEMENT NEGATIVELY IMPACTED
- ✓ FINANCIAL & RESOURCE MISMANAGEMENT
- ✓ PROGRAM EVALUATION NEGATIVELY IMPACTED
- ✓ MAY RESULT IN AERODROMES BEING OUT OF COMPLIANCE



# IBIS STATISTICAL ANALYSIS (2016-2021) SUMMARY OF CHALLENGES

- Not all States submit strike data into IBIS as required per Annex 14 (9.4)
- Lack of data quality (insufficient oversight and validation, differing priorities, language challenges, differing file format, etc.)
- Lack of contact point/responsible person = No dedicated wildlife strike data person
- COVID-19 pandemic period (2019-2021)
- Data from ECCAIRS provides only 14% of total data
- ECCAIRS's insufficient capabilities require ICAO to transfer ECCAIRS strike data into ICAO Excel files
- Majority of data is gathered by ICAO direct request from State's POC = Inefficient and labor intensive


## How Can a Global BSC be Beneficial?







- 1. **DISSEMINATE INFORMATION** be the global clearinghouse of information
- 2. FACILITATE SUPPORT & GUIDANCE assist existing and new BSCs with ICAO and BMP guidance, training
- 3. FOCUS ON INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATION OVER FORMAL PARTNERSHIPS create buy-in from national and regional BSCs through information sharing & cooperation; continue collaboration with global aviation community, pilots, airlines, aerodromes, ATC, biologists, researchers, insurance companies, etc...
- 4. ASSIST GLOBAL COMMUNITY WITH WILDLIFE STRIKE COLLECTION, ANALYSIS, SUBMISSION TO IBIS AND DATA SHARING
