- to integrate the WHMP into CSR

Fraport Greece: The Concession Project at a Glance



- 40-year concession of 14 Regional Airports
- Scope: upgrade, operate and continuously develop all Airports
- €1.234 billion Upfront Concession Fee
- Initial capex of at least €415 million until 2021
- Annual Fixed Concession fee of €23 million
- Annual Variable Concession Fee of on average 28.5% of Operational Profit

- -Wildlife Strike Risk Assessment (periodically & annually)
- Wildlife Strike Risk Mitigation
- –Assurance (lagging & leading KPIs)
- –Promotion (training & communication)


Wildlife Hazard Management Cornerstone

- ✓ IT solutions for data collection and analysis
- ✓ Innovative training methods
- ✓ Case studies
- ✓ Exchange of experience
- ✓ Continuous training development
- ✓ Proficiency check

How do we ensure that all wildlife strikes are reported?



- ✓ % Airport reporting as leading KPI
- ✓ DNA analysis for bird strike remains
- ✓ Regular meetings with the airlines to cross check wildlife strike databases (incident by incident and/or on annually basis)
- Continuous awareness seminars on reporting culture to FG personnel
- ✓ Invest in dedicated expert personnel




Communication – Internal Upstream

- ✓ Mention the expected safety benefits





- Ensure that all wildlife strikes are reported


Personnel Development
